When The Waters Rise

Dearest Church,

Thank y'all (Pastor Carolyn picked up a new word in Texas!) for all the support for the Shining Light Mission trip! So many individuals and congregations gave generous financial gifts. So many people were encouraging us, praying for us and cheering us on. We can't say it enough: Thank you!

The trip was awesome, and although we were pretty worn out on our first day back at home, both of us were already missing our fellow travelers. We wish we could have stayed even longer! Speaking from the Pastors' point of view: it was an entirely awesome and meaningful trip, and we're ready to go back! One individual from the group commented, "I don't think there was one person on the trip who wouldn't do it again."

Here's a brief recap, with some pictures we want to share:



On Memorial Day this past year, in a very strange fluke, two storm fronts came together near the San Marcos, Texas area. About 18 inches of rain fell in one night, and drained into the Blanco River and little rivers and creeks in the area. Because there was so much debris washed into the river, it got caught on a bridge, forming a debris dam. The water built up, and finally when the dam broke, a 40 foot wall of water went gush-

ing down an already flooded river. This picture shows a large tree that was uprooted. We were told that 300 and 500 year

old trees were washed away. 12 people lost their lives.

And so we were blessed to be there to be a part of God's healing, just like the rainbow God sent Noah after the flood. On our first day, we helped a man, Mike, who lost almost everything, including his vehicle, his home, and most of his belongings. His house was so ruined that he had to tear it all down and burn it.

We sure had our work cut out for us! Mike had already accomplished a lot on his own, but when we arrived he told us that up to this point he had been working entirely by himself to rebuild his house. We were able to do lots of work there like insulating and sheetrocking, as well as cleaning up some of the remaining debris that was washed into his yard. Parts of our group ended up being at Mike's for 3 out of our four work days. This was a major project, and Mike appreciated it. But what he seemed to appreciate the most was the companionship. Up to this point he had worked alone, now he had a



whole group of people willing to jump in. He relished the opportunity to share his stories and his life with us. Our willingness to join him spoke louder than any amount of work we were able to do. Our crew was so big that we had to split up. While some worked at Mike's, others were at a total of three other homes. Our kids did a great job as well, helping out *El Buen Pastor*, an Hispanic church consisting of mostly elderly members, and also a food pantry. They learned how to sing "Jesus Loves Me" in Spanish and were fascinated to get to know



people and hear their stories. We worshiped together with that Hispanic church on Sunday morning, hearing the Gospel in both English and Spanish. Our kids even provided special music and got to show off their new language abilities.

Some of our kids also got to meet Mike. They really wanted to hear his story about the night of the flood. They were especially transfixed by the story of how Mike risked his life to save his neighbor's two dogs that were chained up. Here is Mike visiting with the kids, complete with the walking sticks he made for them out of cedar from his yard.



Again, thank you all so much for supporting this great trip. We are blessed to be a blessing!

Making the God Connection...

And I am sure of this. began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ.

Philippians 1:6

Is Sunday morning (or whatever day of the week you worship) connected to the rest of the minutes, hours and days of your week? Worship can either be an event to attend or a way of living. If it is an event to attend - then it is confined to one hour, to one place (whatever building you gather in), on the other hand if it is a way of life then we seek to live immersed in our baptism, being Christ's presence wherever we are and with whomever we encounter. Let me be honest, it is nearly impossible to always be Christ's presence – we are sinners after all. But I do want to argue that faith in Christ was never meant to be a weekly event; instead we are invited to live a daily God-shaped faith journey.

So, what does it look like to be involved in a living faith journey? It might look like wondering where that He who God is at work in your family, neighborhood, workplace, school or congregation? It might look like taking stock of how you are spending your time - in what ways are you using your God-given gifts to love and care for your neighbor? It could mean thinking about your daily work, whatever that is whether you are paid for it or not and deeply ponder how might God be using you during those hours or how might God use you?

> A daily faith journey is connected to God's Word. It can be as easy as reading a chapter a day from the Bible and pondering what God is saying through God's Word. It might be followed by a time of prayer lifting up to God your joys and sorrows, your fears and questions. I keep a sheet of paper in my Bible to keep a running prayer list – a way to remind myself of the people and things I need to be praying about.

> A daily faith journey is best walked with others. Who might you be able to trust to talk with about deep issues of faith? Might you be the one to start a Bible Study/Faith Talk group in your congregation, neighborhood or place of work?

You are a baptized child of God, you are called to walk daily, dripping wet, remember those waters and that you have been claimed as God's very own child. You have been claimed, not just in your hour of worship but all of you - every bit of you - and every moment of your life.

Mountrail County Food Pantry

Our food pantry served 60 families, with 199 people....86 of those children, 11 seniors.

We gave out 6176 pounds of food, and that does not count the turkeys that we offered our clients.

(Cashwise was wonderful to work with, and made up coupons that we could give out. When a client turned one of those in, they were given a 10 to 13 pound turkey. We gave our 40 of those in November for Thanksgiving, and I don't have a tally yet for December...but Cashwise will let us know in the days ahead.)

They have taken very good care of us....giving us bakery donations every week to hand out, delivering of our needed foods, so that we don't have to figure out how to get all of that food here in the working day, and being so willing to make up the coupons. It is so nice to have a store that supports the local food pantry so well.




