Lord, what would you have us do???

Happy New Year! What are your plans? The beginning of the year is like a painter with a blank canvas in front of them, there are endless opportunities to live the Good News of Jesus Christ in your community.

The beginning of the year is the perfect time of year for a church council and rostered leaders to lead the congregation in setting goals for ministry

together. Some great questions to talk about are:

-What is the most important thing we do as a congregation?

(Believe it or not looking at your congregational constitution can be helpful because it defines why your congregation exists.)

- -Since time is a limited resource, how do we want to encourage members of the congregation to spend their time in faith-building activities?
- -How will our congregation help people deepen their faith in Jesus?
- -What can our congregation do to help people connect their faith and daily life?

You will notice this is a forward looking activity, pushing the council and pastor to lead conversation, listen closely and to be responsible for setting a course for the congregation.

Can we really dream a new dream???

Filling a blank canvas begins with noticing. What has changed in your community? In your congregation? What are the resources God has provided? Assets are more than money, they include people, your space, equipment, and financial resources. What are the passions of people around you?

Someone much smarter than I has written that God has provided us with absolutely everything we need to do the ministry God has set before us. In other words, God is not expecting us to do anything that God has not already provided the tools with which to accomplish the ministry.

All of this is about sharing the Jesus story with others. We do it through our words and our actions. Our churches exist to "Tell the old, old story..." both within our congregations and through the people who are the members.

Annual Review...

Believe it or not what you do at the beginning of the year to lay out the priorities and goals of your ministry is the starting point of an end of the year annual review. Synod staff often get phone calls in late November or early December asking if we have material to help a council do pastoral evaluations. Evaluations are best done when congregation and leaders have spent time setting goals – it is in light of those goals or priorities that our ministry together is evaluated.

Evaluation helps a congregation access what has been done well, where have positive steps been taken, what did not work well. It allows us to ask why somethings worked well and others did not.

Synod Council to Meet...

The Western North Dakota Synod council will meet February 10 & 11 in Minot. If you have items that you believe should be addressed by council give me a call.

At this meeting your synod council will be making adjustments to the 2017 budget and approving a budget for 2018 which will be presented to Synod Assembly for conversation. We will also engage conversation around openings in our synod and talk about raising up new leaders.

Constitutional Changes...

At the end of November notice was sent to all of our congregations about proposed changes to the synod constitution. Those changes will be voted on at our synod assembly this coming June. Please take time to review the documents. A link to the documents can be found on the front page of the synod web site.

God's Blessings to all of you in the New Year! May Christ's light continue to shine in your life.

Senior Companions coming to Stanley?
Need: In-home services for growing
Lutheran
Social elderly population. Due to their age
and health conditions, the elderly population is at greater risk of costly nursing
home placement. With some extra help,

those elderly people will be able to remain in their homes. North Dakota Long Term Care Association indicates in their Data book that people who participate in some form of social activities decrease their chances of nursing home placement. Also, they indicate the number one reason a person enters a nursing home is a loss of a caregiver. The average cost of nursing home in North Dakota is \$9,400 per month.

Solution: In-home visiting volunteers. The Lutheran Social Services Senior Companions program can fill this need for in-home services in Stanley by placing volunteers in homes of elderly people. Volunteers are older adults (age 55 or over) since they can relate better to the problems of other elderly people. Volunteers provide a variety of services including: assisting with dressing and grooming, medication reminders, taking seniors for a walk or doing light exercise with them, preparing a light meal, help with grocery shopping, monitoring nutrition, providing companionship and conversation, playing mind-stimulating games, reading and writing for visually-impaired seniors, light housekeeping and respite care for primary caregivers.

HISTORY

Congressional interest in establishing a program targeted to provide service for and by older persons began in 1968. In 1973, the Senior Companions Program concept was incorporated into the Domestic Volunteer Service Act. Since that time, the Senior Companions Program has expanded throughout the United States.

Authorized and funded by Congress, the program is administered by the Corporation for National and Community Service which monitors and advises local projects.

North Dakota, through the support of Lutheran Social Services of North Dakota, adopted the Senior Companions Program in 1981 and has been the sponsoring agency for the Senior Companions Program ever since. Lutheran Social Services Senior Companions is funded by Federal/State government as well as private and public donations.

The mission of the Senior Companions program is to provide meaningful retirement opportunities for low-to-middle income persons 55 years or older by assisting other adults and seniors who need person -to-person support because of loneliness, illness or disability. By tak-

ing care of simple chores and offering contact to the outside world, Senior Companions often provide the services that frail elderly need to live independently.

Through their assistance and friendship, Senior Companions help others live independently in their homes rather than having to move to more expensive institutional care. Senior Companions offer contact with the outside world and help make the lives of the people they serve less lonely. Volunteering also gives the companions a chance to be active in the community and to make a difference in someone else's life. For many companions, their visits give them the activity and energy they need to handle their own aging.

The Senior Companions services include providing companionship and conversation, playing cards or games, reading and writing for visually impaired seniors, doing light housekeeping and providing respite care for primary caregivers. There is no cost to the client for this service. The elderly clients benefit from the program by staying longer in their homes and enjoying a better quality of life.

The Senior Companions program of Lutheran Social Services of ND serves about **500** elderly people in their homes through the volunteer services of **70** Senior Companions working out of **42** Volunteer Stations statewide.

Senior Companions Program seeks healthy, active senior adults in Stanley and surrounding area. Who can serve as a Senior Companion?

Persons are eligible to become a volunteer Senior Companion with stipend pay if they are age 55 and over, meet moderate-income guidelines and are able to serve at least 15 hours per week.

Most Senior Companions find that the greatest benefits of serving are the personal satisfaction from helping appreciative clients as well as the friendships that develop with other Senior Companion volunteers.

In addition, Senior companions receive mileage reimbursement or transportation is provided, paid training, accident insurance while on assignment and other benefits that are not taxable and do not reduce any other government assistance that they may receive.

Report from our parish supported Food Pantry

In November, the Mountrail County food pantry served 53 families, for a total of 156 people, 49 were children and 16 were seniors.

Our food pantry gave away 5012 pounds of food, not to mention the turkeys that we were able to provide!! (folks picked them up at the store, so we don't know the pounds of turkey that were given out)


