From Our Pastor Carter's Thoughts

It has been a very busy two weeks from the six services during Holy Week to walking with two families after the death of a loved one. I am tired, but honestly, it is a good kind of tired. It is a kind of tired that comes only after knowing and feeling the presence of the Holy Spirit among us.

I say that because as I was passing through the fellowship hall at American Lutheran yesterday, a few of the quilting ladies stopped me and told me I should try to preach more about the Holy Spirit because they are interested in what role the Spirit plays in our lives. A few even commented that Lutherans are scared of the Spirit. Which is a comment I have heard many times actually. So, what then does the role of the Spirit play in our lives? The answer is everything.

In the Nicene Creed we confess that we believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life. When you were born the very spirit of God was breathed into you, and the Spirit does not simply stop there. The Holy Spirit is the very agent of which we came to believe. The Holy Spirit speaks to us through the Word of God, and creates within us the ability to believe in our salvation that has been given to us by Jesus Christ's death on the cross and his resurrection to new life. If it were not for the Spirit, simply, we would not be.

I believe Martin Luther explains it best. He writes: "I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith." You believe, not because of your own understanding, but because of how the Holy Spirit has worked with your lives.

As I mentioned, I am a good kind of tired because I have encountered the Holy Spirit these past weeks. Worshipping with you, and walking with you in grief and loss are holy moments. They are moments in which Christ is revealed to me, and Christ is revealed to me through the Spirit. I heard many comments that people found *my* Good Friday service very powerful. I am very thankful that this service spoke to you, however, it was never *my* service, but it was God's.

Also, it was not me that made this powerful to you, but it was the Holy Spirit working among you and within you, for it is the Holy Spirit that helps you see Christ in others, and be Christ to our others.

So where do you see God in your daily life? Where do you see the Holy Spirit working within you helping you to believe? Where do you see the Spirit working within others helping them to believe? Where do you see the Holy Spirit within your own lives, and the lives of others, helping you and all of God's people to be the hands and feet of Christ to others?

An elderly Catholic Sister (a nun) was on her death bed. Her name was Sister Margaret. I'm sure someday I will tell you more about her. I got to know her well during her final days in the hospital, and in a moment of my own doubt and unbelief, she taught me more about the Spirit than I could have ever imagined. She, through the Holy Spirit, sensed my anxiety, my fear, and my doubt. In this moment, she told me to grab the Bible from her bedside table. The leather bound binding was worn in one place, it was a very clear handprint from where she had carried her this Bible for more than 90 years. She told me to turn to Romans Chapter Eight. Read verse nine she instructed. So I did, "But you are not in the flesh; you are in the Spirit, since the Spirit of God dwells in you." "Breathe in," she instructed. "Do you feel that?" She asked. "Do you feel that sense of peace? That slight moment of calmness and that slight moment of knowing that God exists?" She paused as I continued to breathe. "That is the Holy Spirit within you, restoring you, and making you whole once again."

So I invite you, my dear parish, to follow those instructions from Sister Margaret. I invite you to breathe, and to feel the spirit among you. O, Spirit, seep in. Seep into our fears and our anxieties. Seep in between us, and make us whole. O, Spirit, seep into every fiber of our being to help us know that we are loved forever and always by our God and creator. May the Spirit be ever present to you this day and always, my dear church.

Who will serve?

Ministry is not a numbers game, it is all about relationships. Ministry happens as people of God gather around Word and Sacrament working to connect the Holy with everyday life. Ministry happens in worship on Sunday, around the dinner table on Monday and in faithful work any day of the week. Ministry happens as people share their hopes and dreams, their fears and their failings.

Ministry can happen anywhere or at any time. Ministry is the work of all of God's people.

Some people though are called or set aside for specific roles of ministry within the community of faith. Pastor or Deacon, even Synodically Authorized Ministers in training for ordination are set aside to serve. Who will step into these roles in the years to come?

Troubling Numbers...

We have gone through the spring assignment process – Western North Dakota was blessed to receive 2 candidates. We are thankful to God for these individuals however we reported 12 congregations or parishes in need of a first call candidate.

Across the entire church, we are dealing with a declining number of individuals entering seminary. Many of those who are entering seminary are not from rural places, so the thought of serving in a rural setting is unsettling for many.

What shall we do?

Whether or not your congregation has an opening at this moment should not matter, because we are in this together. The truth is that in the last 5 years 65% of our congregations have been or are in the call process. This is our issue together; both town and country churches have openings. Some have been waiting up to three years for the right candidate.

All of us can keep our eyes open for people whom we believe have the gifts for service within the church. Pray for them and encourage them to consider serving the church as a pastor or deacon. We all can financially support those who are in seminary, as concern over educational debt is one of the hurdles facing candidates considering seminary.

Discernment Retreats...

We are noticing that the more we talk about the need for qualified candidates, the more people begin to ask questions. We are in conversation with a number of people about the possibility of entering into theological education.

Our next Discernment Retreat is scheduled for June 23-24 at Camp of the Cross. At this event individuals will have a chance to ask questions, talk with others who are wrestling with a call to ministry, as well as worship and pray together. This is a cooperative effort of the synods in North Dakota, South Dakota and Minnesota. For more information, call the synod office 701-223-5312 or email beth@wndsynod.org.

The Synod Assembly is the annual gathering of all 172 congregations of the Western North Dakota Synod Assembly. We gather together for worship, education, celebration, and to do the business of this synod.

Any member of any congregation of the Western North Dakota Synod is invited to register and participate in synod assembly. Each congregation elects lay voting members based on their baptized membership numbers (see <u>Voting Member Information for ratio on next page</u>). All other (non-delegate) members are invited to register as visitors to the assembly and may participate in all aspects of the assembly including worship, workshops, presentations, meals, etc.; however, visitors do not have voice or vote in elections or business items on the assembly agenda. Rostered ministers (pastors and ELCA deacons) who hold a letter of call from a congregation or synod council, as well as retired rostered leaders also have voice and vote in the assembly plenary sessions. SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

OPPEBOEN SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES

- 1. Recipient of the scholarship should be a member of American Lutheran Church or another ELCA congregation in the Stanley, N.D. area.
- 2. First consideration should be given to a person planning a career as a minister, parish worker, youth director, missionary, or other such related Christian work.
- 3. The Scholarship will still be awarded annually even if none of the applicants qualify under guideline #2.
- 4. Financial need will be one of the factors taken into consideration.
- 5. The recipient of the scholarship should be actively involved in the life of the congregation to which they belong.
- 6. Application for the scholarship should be made no later than <u>May 15</u> of each year. The scholarship will be awarded on <u>July 31</u> of each year.
- 7. There are no restrictions regarding the number of years a person can apply for and/or receive this scholarship.

Oppeboen's Scholarship due May 15th!

The Oppeboen Scholarship is offered for American Lutheran Church members attending or planning to attend an educational institution (tech school, college, university, seminary) following high school graduation; the scholarship is also available to those going onto further education after they receive their college degree and those working towards a degree.

The scholarship award is payable to the college in August and January. The forms have been mailed to high school seniors and are also available in the church office.

Two recommendations are required for first time applicants, one from a pastor and one from a teacher. Past recipients need to fill out an application and write an essay about where you are going and what you are studying. As in the past, Marichel distributes the applications and writes the scholarship checks and is happy to answer any questions you may have regarding the Oppeboen Scholarship, (628-2550).

Concordia College

Are you planning to go to Concordia College in Moorhead, MN? In keeping with its commitment to provide a liberal arts education of high quality at an affordable cost, Concordia maintains one of the lowest tuition rates and largest financial aid programs among comparable private colleges in the region. One of these sources is a partnership between Concordia College and church congregations. Concordia will match congregational scholarships up to \$1,000 per year. Scholarship notification forms are due to the Concordia Financial Aid Office no later than August 15, 2017. The application may be completed on line. This scholarship is offered by American Lutheran and Bethlehem Lutheran Congregations. Marichel also manages the funds for this scholarship and is very happy to answer your questions.

Sunday School news


