# Some Words from Sarah

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ! I am excited to be writing this letter to you as your new quarter time Pastoral Intern! Writing this message to you all makes this become even more real to me! Many of you know me but for those of you who do not, here is a little introduction of who I am and about my call to become a Pastor for Prairie Lutheran Parish.

I am married to Clay and we have 3 children; Hannah who will be a Junior, Elle who will be a Freshman, and Calum who will be a 7th Grader at Stanley High School. I am a member of American Lutheran Church, where I was confirmed, married and where my children have been baptized and now confirmed. I am the School Counselor at Stanley High School where I will continue to serve full-time when school begins in August. I love running, reading, traveling, track season and spending time with my family and friends at the lake.

When I think of my call to ministry, I relate most to Moses' story in the Bible...Minus the burning bush speaking to me! I have felt God knocking at my door, telling me that this is my plan. Much like Moses, I said things like, "I'm not good enough" or "I'm not holy enough" and even, "not yet, Lord." And God kept on coming back to me, just like he did to Moses in Exodus. That little voice inside telling me

what God was calling me to do. Then recently after providing pulpit supply some of you have said those very words to me...You were my outer call! It was at this retreat that I set all my excuses aside and decided that I needed to listen to where God was calling me. And the more I thought about it, the more I realized that God is calling me to serve a Parish that I already love and think of as my family. I feel welcome and at home in each of our four churches. I realized that I get to be God's servant and deliver His message in a Parish where I grew up into the person I am today. How blessed can I be? I still felt that God was calling me to continue to serve as the School Counselor at the high school. When I think of my position at the church and the school, I feel that they are closely related. In both places, I am here to lift others up. I am here to help others succeed. I am here to spread the light of Jesus Christ.

# Why Confirmation Matters, But Must Change:

There are new and exciting changes coming to confirmation this year! Our hope is to better enter into the lives of the youth of our parish to teach them not only about what faith is, but also why it matters, and how to continue to nurture it throughout their entire lives. The church is changing. Faith is changing. So the way we live out our faith is also changing. The best part about all this change is that God does not change. The message of grace and love is still the same, but now we must work hard to be sure that it is heard and known. Many of you can remember back to your confirmation days and recall memorizing basically all of Martin Luther's Small Catechism and having to be present in worship 50 out of the 52 Sundays a year. Well, you see, that just doesn't work today. The power wielding days of the church are over. People more often than not attended church because it was an obligation that came with guilt if not fulfilled. That is, for the most part, gone. So how do we change to live into this? Can we keep teaching the boring old Small Catechism? YES! Because what the Small Catechism is not – is a boring old book where words hardly come to life in our minds, but it is a book that is meant to be brought to action! Each word is to be brought to life. We will continue to teach the Creeds and the Ten Commandments, but what I don't care about is whether or a not a person can recite the Creeds from memory or correctly name and order all Ten Commandments, but rather that each and every young person knows the power of saying "I believe in God the Father Almighty, creator of Heaven and Earth." That each person knows how to live into these words.

That the gift of faith to believe is powerful, and it is the basis of everything we are in life for we are created in the image of God. My dear church, we have been great at teaching the catechism, now let's dig deeper into life and teach why it matters because we have not been so great at that. Why does faith matter? I ask all of you to ponder that question, and take away people's usual first answer. Our faith is more than life insurance for eternal life, so why does faith matter beyond our promise to life forever and be reunited in God's kingdom.

On Wednesday September 6<sup>th</sup>, there will be a meeting for parents for confirmation. Parents be on the lookout for letters this month about what time your child's grade will meet that night. Can't wait to see you then!

On September 10th at 10:30am we will gather for Rally Sunday! This is a time where we gather together to uplift the start of the programmatic year for the church. It is a celebration for our young people to be energized for Sunday School, Confirmation, LYO, and it will be a celebration for us as we kick off Parish-Wide Adult Education later this fall. # Strengthening the Core...

Fitness coaches teach that a person needs a strong core – muscles around a person's midsection – as a firm fitness foundation.

The truth is as people of God, gathered into congregations, we need to have a strong core as well.

Synod programmatic staff spent a day in spiritual retreat with Rev. Paul Hoffman this summer. Paul has been leading clergy mentoring groups in Western North Dakota for several years. He is a retired ELCA Pastor, passionate about faith formation, and inviting people into a life-giving relationship with the risen Christ. He is certain that healthy congregations focus on their core — in other words, they invest time and energy on the central things.

What are these central things? Proclamation of the Word in worship, the celebration of Holy Communion, preparing people for the sacrament of Baptism and a solid prayer life. None of this is flashy; it is simply a consistent tending to the gifts we have been given.

I encourage all our congregations to take stock of their core. What happens in your congregation to teach the practice of prayer, of leaning to listen to one another and pray for one another? How is your congregation working to deepen the understanding of what it is that is happening in worship? Why do we do what we do? What does it mean to "gather to be sent"? How is the congregation set up to teach about the sacraments, the incredible gifts being given in these ordinary things made Holy by God's Word?

I invite you to deepen conversation with the leadership of your congregation. May your core, grounded and rooted in Christ, be strengthened.

# Suggestions needed for Nominations/Elections Committee...

This year's Synod Assembly approved changes to the Synod Constitution including how Conference Deans are appointed. The Synod's Nominations and Elections Committee (made up of one person from each conference) are to provide names to the Synod Council for appointment.

The next Synod Council meeting is September 15<sup>th</sup>-16<sup>th</sup>. Prior to that meeting, Nominations and Elections are seeking the names of people interested in serving as Conference Deans in the following conferences:

- -Turtle Mountain: Rev. Kathi Nygaard is serving an unexpired term and is eligible for appointment to what would be her first term.
- -Western Prairie: Rev. Michon Weingartner has served two terms and is not eligible for re-appointment.

Synod Council will be discussing (and possibly approving) Continuing Resolutions which will lay out the complete process which will be used in appointing these positions in the future.

# Prairie Lutheran Parish Staffing Changes - July 11, 2017

My Dear Parish,

I write to you to inform you of some wonderful and exciting things happening in our parish. There are some changes coming in staffing to better serve each and every one of you.

First, Sarah Sorenson has answered God's call to pastoral leadership in the church. She will begin the TEEM program this fall; a program developed for people to take a different track toward ordination rather than the usual Master of Divinity route at a seminary by serving the church throughout their entire education; this education takes place primarily online. Until Sarah finishes her education and is able to be called and ordained here (a conversation and congregational votes that will take place when she completes her required classes), she will be a synodically authorized minister (SAM). A SAM holds all responsibilities of a pastor including presiding over weddings, baptisms, and communion. However, they are only authorized to perform such duties within the parish they are assigned.

Sarah has discerned for some time that her call to be a school counselor is not over, so she will join us on a one-fourth-time basis as she continues to serve the school full-time. We give thanks that she has answered God's calling to be a pastor, and I look forward to Christ's ministry she will carry out in our congregations, and I know you all will too.

Second, since Sarah's call will only be a quarter time, the parish board passed some other moves towards fully staffing our parish. One major shift will be using John Mogren, our Parish Administrator, in new ways. John has a passion for outreach and uplifting the spiritual gifts of all people! A portion of his job duties including creating bulletins, the newsletter, and other secretarial tasks will be given to the new position of parish secretary, and John will now fill the remainder of his full-time position with various areas of ministry for the parish. If you are interested in the secretary position; a forty hour per month position please email John Mogren at:

office@prairielutheranparish.org to receive a full job description.

Eden Cuypers, our Parish Youth Worker, will begin to work a few more hours for us each week to expand her position from not only youth, but also family based intergenerational ministry. There are also conversations happening with someone experienced in pastoral visitation that could help assist our parish a few hours per week, so we meet as many visitation needs as possible.

It is an exciting time to be church together. We are using creative ways to staff our parish as the pastoral shortage crisis in our church becomes even greater. We give thanks to Sarah for answering God's call, and we give thanks to all others for being open and willing to try new things. I am excited to see what the future holds as we move forward with a full staff towards offering new programs for families, fellowship for not only youth, but young-adults, Bible-studies and Christian Education for all ages, and whatever else all of you and we as your parish staff can dream of together.

As I have said since I arrived here, "we are better together," and that we are my dear friends. We may think we are four small churches, but together, we make one large church; we make a powerful Christian community. So, let us move boldly towards the future holding true to our roots of each congregation, but also seeing the greatness we have as a community together as the Prairie Lutheran Parish.

My dear parish, let us cultivate a place together in our community where people can come and know they are loved, forgiven, and freed by Christ's death and resurrection, and also loved deeply by all of us as we live into our Christian vocation of choosing love over hate, and loving our neighbors so deeply it hurts. Let us proclaim from floor to rafter, that all are welcome here in this place. The Holy Spirit is alive, active, and moving fast in this place, so grab on, and hold on tight, and let's see where God takes us!

"The Pantry"

The Prairie Lutheran Parish will be teaming up with other local churches, the Stanley Park District, Mountrail County Health Foundation and the Stanley Public Schools to help with the fact that children in our area are not getting the nutritious food they need on a regular basis. Nearly one in six children in America lives in households that struggle to put food on the table. That means they struggle with hunger sometime during the year.

Starting on Friday, September 8th, "The Portable Pantry" will allow children in the Stanley elementary school that are on the free or reduced meals program to bring home a bag of food each Friday. Each week a group will get together in a classroom at the Elementary school and bag up the food for each child designated in a reusable grocery bag.

In the near future, "The Pantry" will be setup at the high school where students can go shop for what they need.

Informational brochures and applications for this program will be available at each local church and at the Grade School and High School guidance counselors' offices.

Cashwise has graciously approved to mark the food items The Pantry board has chosen for the month so shoppers can pick up items as they shop. A large tote will be placed up front for drop off of the food purchased by shoppers.

The local churches are spearheading this campaign with seed money to start it off with and food donations. Grants will also be applied for once The Pantry has its 501c3 accreditation. Sunday October 29, 2017 - 11 a.m. -




