## October Gospel Seeds

\*Monthly Update from the Western North Dakota Synod Office



### Getting to Know Western ND...

It is a gift to be able to host guests from our Churchwide office. In mid-September, we were visited by Victoria Flood, the ELCA Director of Mission Support and Nick Kiger, Associate Director of Mission Support. They came to be a part of our Synod Council meeting, to engage with us in conversation around ministry on our territory and the ministry we are involved in - together - across

the United States and around the world.

They arrived on Thursday, September 15 and stayed through Sunday, September 18. This allowed time for meetings with clergy and chances to tour both rural and town settings of our synod. It also gave them multiple opportunities to hear about our changing landscape, as well as, worship in five different congregations while they were here. (Yes, we kept them on the move.)

We are partners in this Gospel work, and it is important we tell the stories of the incredible Christ centered ministry happening in this part of God's world. It is good to have guests who can hear the passion of our people.

We also learned more about what is happening across our church. We talked together about how Mission Support - the undesignated dollars your congregation shares with the Synod and Churchwide - is helping start new congregations, transform other congregations, put missionaries around the world, train up new leaders and much more.

The most frequent words Victoria and Nick used were "Thank-You". They were thankful for our partnership, your faithfulness and for the way people on this territory work to share God's love with our neighbors.

### Council Actions...

Some of the actions taken during September's Synod Council meeting:

\*Approved a Mission Support Strategy which seeks to continue to grow the amount of money we share with our Churchwide partner over the next 5 years. By 2021, the goal is to share with our Churchwide partner 50% of the undesignated giving shared by congregations with the synod.

\*Approved a plan to have Faith Simonieg work as a planned giving

consultant within the synod on a part-time basis; her work will be helping individuals with gift plans and congregations create endowment funds.

\*Agreed to participate in a study process to help identify ways to assist small member congregations find new and creative ways to enhance worship music. The study is being led by Jay Beech and Dr. Rollie Martinson.

\*Reviewed the results of the synod audit.

\*Heard that revenue from congregations to the synod is slightly down compared to the same period last year.

\*Spent time talking about issues of race, the Churchwide Assembly action to repudiate the Doctrine of Discovery and how we, as a synod, might work to build stronger relationships with our Native American neighbors.

\*Approved a number of changes to the Synod Constitution. Those changes will be made available to congregations of the synod and will be voted on at our next Synod Assembly. Those changes include removal of term limits for the bishop.

\*Directed staff to redraft the 2017 Synod Budget and return the stewardship position to half-time. The redrafted budget will be reviewed by Synod Council at its February meeting.

Synod Staff and Synod Council members would love to be invited to talk with your church council, lead an adult forum, do a brief temple talk or any other opportunity to talk with church groups about our work together. ### **Message from Pastor Carter Hill**

The Apostle Paul writes that in Christ we are continually made new creations. Everything old has passed away. Behold, everything has become new! New beginnings are filled with various feelings all across the spectrum of emotions, and here you find yourselves at the crossroads of pastoral leadership changes which include many goodbyes and hellos. And with each of these goodbyes and hellos comes a new beginning that brings about these different emotions: sadness, worry, relief, the grief of losing leaders, and hope and excitement in seeing what new leadership can bring to this place. My dear friends in Christ of the Prairie Lutheran Parish, you are in for many new beginnings, and I am excited to join with you in one of them. My name is Carter Hill, and I will be your interim from October 1st through the end of the year. It is a short time, yes, but in that time we will be able to accomplish great things. I will be able to hear what makes you proud to be a part of the Prairie Lutheran Parish and together we can enter into faithful conversations about what your hopes and dreams are for the future. I have been hired by your parish council to carry out the duties that come along with the office of pastor. I have been hired to preach and administer the sacraments, teach confirmation, provide pastoral care to those homebound, to those facing crisis, and to anyone in need, and to work along side your wonderful staff. I am also hear to listen, have conversations, and mend relationships with members that have fallen away from the church over the past few years. Coming to serve God along with all of you in your setting is an exciting time for me. It will be a welcomed return to the earliest roots of my life. I was baptized and spent my earliest years at Immanual Lutheran Church in Roseglen, North Dakota — one of the four congregations that made up the Prairie Rose Parish. A white steeple that could be seen for miles scraped the open skies telling everyone that passed that God is not dead here in the wonderful prairies of North Dakota, but that God is present and alive among us. I look forward to visiting with you, and getting to know you. Know that my phone is always on, and I am always prepared to listen and help in any way that I can.

A familiar face to welcome you at Prairie Lutheran Parish Marichel Mariscal began working for American Lutheran Church in August of 1976. She began working afternoons (part time) doing office work. The increase came when she accepted the Treasurer position that was vacated by Dolly Ellis. Marichel has seen many changes over the years in the way that things are done. 
