Pastor Carter writes....

Let me tell you this — if you can even believe it — I have been your pastor for one year. This is now my 13th newsletter article to you all, and although many would say 13 is unlucky, the exact opposite is what comes to mind as I reflect back on the past year with you all. I don't think there is a day that goes by where I don't stop and think about how incredibly blessed I am to serve alongside all of you. Since the day I arrived it has been a great blessing to get to know all of you. Not only as wonderful people, but also as four congregations that each function so differently, yet still work together in a beautiful partnership. A partnership that I hope you feel has flourished and strengthened over this past year.

Together we have had conversations about the directions our parish should take in the future, and through those conversations, we have instilled changes to our education programs. We have reformatted confirmation to hopefully better influence the faith lives of our young people. We have added adult education and Bible study to better serve you, and Wednesday Church School attendance has increased to over 60 kids each week, while we continue to worship 60 to 80 people on Wednesday evenings.

Together we have entered into new staffing models and I give thanks to the Parish Board for trusting my leadership as we venture into new territory not only within our churches, but the greater church as a whole. We will only continue to reach more and more people as each new position begins to fall into place.

Together we have rejoiced with Sarah Sorenson as she answered God's call to ordained ministry. Let us continue to support her and pray for her as she continues with her education.

Together, under the direction of Eden Cuypers, Parish Youth Director, our Junior High and High School youth programs have grown from 2 to 3 youth to 18 to 25 students actively attending most weeks. Recently we have registered 22 youth and 8 adults for the National Youth Gathering in Houston in the summer of 2018. This is to be celebrated!

Together we have mourned great losses to our parish. We have commended some of our best to eternal life, and there is great grief left among us. May the Spirit of God continue to enter into those that mourn, so they can feel peace once again.

Together we have also failed one another. We have made one another upset and unhappy. We have disagreed, but we have also entered into faithful, grace-filled conversations to discuss our differences and focus on forgiveness to better serve the gospel here in this place each and every day.

Together, we have embraced change, and now we continue to look toward the future. My prayer is that we continue to be open to hearing God's call as to where we are heading, and respond faithfully and with great trust.

Together, we are best, my dear parish. You are an incredibly gifted, dedicated, and faithful group of people, and I can't wait to see what the coming years have in store for us together.

Synod Council Meets...

September 15 and 16 the Western North Dakota Synod Council met at Good Shepherd Lutheran in Bismarck. Below are some of the issues which came before your synod council.

- -Friday evening council was joined by Lorraine Davis, Executive Director of the Native American Development Center, Scott Davis, Director ND Indian Affairs Commission and Dr. Leander McDonald, President of United Tribes Technical College. These three guests helped us engage conversation around the question: How can the church be a partner in building bridges between native and non-native people.
- -Spent time in conversation around open congregational calls in the synod and creative ways ministry is being provided across the synod
- -Talked about the marks of a Vital Congregation and how leaders have the ability to impact congregational vitality
- -Talked about a special candidate within our synod that staff are seeking an internship site for
- -Walked through plans for the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation Worship service planned for October 29th at the Bismarck Event Center
- -Agreed to bring an amendment to the synod constitution which would add another seat on synod council for a person of color
- -Approved a Continuing Resolution on how the Synod's Nominating Committee will seek candidates for Conference Deans and Conference Secretaries
- -Appointed Rev. Christina Martin Heart River Conference Dean, Rev. Kathleen Nygard, Turtle Mountain Conference Dean, Rev. Carter Hill Western Prairie Conference Dean and Rev. Nicole Martin and Rev. David Maxfield as Upper Missouri Co-Conference Deans

"The Pantry"

The Prairie Lutheran Parish will be teaming up with other local churches, the Stanley Park District, Mountrail County Health Foundation and the Stanley Public Schools to help with the fact that children in our area are not getting the nutritious food they need on a regular basis. Nearly one in six children in America lives in households that struggle to put food on the table. That means they struggle with hunger sometime during the year.

Starting on Friday, September 8th, "The Portable Pantry" will allow children in the Stanley elementary school that are on the free or reduced meals program to bring home a bag of food each Friday. Each week a group will get together in a classroom at the Elementary school and bag up the food for each child designated in a reusable grocery bag.

In the near future, "The Pantry" will be setup at the high school where students can go shop for what they need.

Informational brochures and applications for this program will be available at each local church and at the Grade School and High School guidance counselors' offices.

Cashwise has graciously approved to mark the food items The Pantry board has chosen for the month so shoppers can pick up items as they shop. A large tote will be placed up front for drop off of the food purchased by shoppers.

The local churches are spearheading this campaign with seed money to start it off with and food donations. Grants will also be applied for once The Pantry has its 501c3 accreditation. But, this is a community effort, so any service organization that would like to help bag food for a week, donate food or money or help with any needed movement of food please contact Steph Everett at 628-1405 or talk to Sarah Sorenson or Eden Cuypers!

If you are interested in helping pack bags of food for the elementary school for our S.A.C.K Program, We will be packing at 5:00 on the dates listed. Please let Pastoral Intern Sarah know if you are interested in helping. We need 4-5 helpers each time and it takes about an hour to pack the bags. Thank you!

Mountrail County Food Pantry is a Prairie Lutheran Parish supported ministry.

Our food pantry served 53 households in August, for a total of 145 people. Of those, 57 were children and 18 were seniors. We provided 5430 pounds of food to these families!

If you are one of the folks that generously help us unload the truck, that amount of pounds will not surprise you!! Hunger in Mountrail County

An estimated 850 individuals, or one in 18 of your Mountrail County neighbors turned to the Great Plains Food Bank partner agencies and feeding programs to meet their nutritional needs in 2016.



Vol. 21*). But what we need to remember is that salvation is not something yet to come; justification is already complete (*LW, Vol. 34*).
