
No December Gospel Seeds (report) this month. Merry Christmas to all from the Western North Dakota Synod.

The Story Behind "Away In A Manger"
No Christmas song is more loved than this tender children's carol. With its simply worded expression of love for the Lord Jesus and trust in His faithful care, the hymn appeals to young and old alike. It is usually one of the first Christmas songs learned in early childhood; yet its pleasing melody and gentle message preserve it in our affections all through life.

For some time "Away in the Manger" was titled "Luther's Cradle Hymn." It was thought to have been written by Martin Luther for his own children and then passed on by German mothers. Modern research discounts this claim, however. Stanzas one and two first appeared in the Little Children's Book, published in Philadelphia in 1885. The third verse was written by a Methodist minister, John T. McFarland, in the early 1900s when an additional stanza for this carol was desired for use at a church children's day program.

How important it is that we take time to help our children see beyond the glitter of the Christmas season and teach them the true meaning of Christ's birth. The most thrilling story ever known to man began in Bethlehem at Christmas.

Away in a manger, no crib for a bed, the little Lord Jesus laid down His sweet head; the stars in the sky looked down where He lay, the little Lord Jesus, asleep on the hay. The cattle are lowing, the Baby awakes, but little Lord Jesus, no crying He makes; I love Thee, Lord Jesus! look down from the sky, and stay by my cradle till morning is nigh. Be near me, Lord Jesus, I ask Thee to stay close by me forever, and love me, I pray; bless all the dear children in Thy tender care, and fit us for heaven, to live with Thee there.

What is Luther Hall?



Social residential psychiatric treatment facility that serves youth ages 10 to 18 who have been diagnosed with

a psychiatric disorder and need 24-hour care and treatment. Qualified mental health professionals provide each resident with an individualized plan to meet their specific needs, carried out through individual, group and family therapies integrated into the daily living program.

Lutheran Social Services Luther Hall was the Barbara Allen-Hagen award recipient this August, 2016. Winners were selected for changing facility cultures and practices to align with research and best practices that lead to positive youth outcomes. Ryan Daniel, Bob Guertin and Tyler Holland attended the award ceremony in Boston, Massachusetts to accept the award from the Council of Juvenile Correctional Administrators (CJCA).

Lutheran Social Services of North Dakota Guided by God's love and grace, Lutheran Social Services of North Dakota brings healing, help and hope. The Mountrail County food pantry served 43 families in October, providing 3725.50 pounds of food. A total of 133 people were served, of which 54 were children and 11 were seniors. We received 179.5 of garden produce from folks. © Here is a perfect example of the caring community that we live in. A lifetime resident of the area walked in, and she handed over a check "to pay for Thanksgiving turkeys"!! So, our clients will definitely have a Thanksgiving turkey this year!! And to add to the amazement of this story....when I called Cashwise to set up the voucher system, they said that another person had already told them that he wanted to fund Thanksgiving turkeys! I contacted the gentleman, and told him our story, and he happily agreed to provide Christmas turkeys instead. So, we will have Christmas turkeys, as well for families of our area!!

Cashwise has been wonderful to the food pantry, as well. They have let us set up a little wagon by the door, where folks can drop in any items to donate. Cashwise has been donating the foods that they are allowed to donate, which goes right out the door the day it comes in!! People are excited to have these treats, since much of this food is not something the food pantry carries. Cashwise also has created a coupon for the checkout counters to purchase a gallon of milk for the pantry, or coupons worth 2 or 5 dollars that can be purchased at the counter, and that money will go to our food pantry!

If folks would like to donate food items for Thanksgiving and Christmas; there are several things that seem to go very quickly. Instant mashed potatoes, gravy, sweet potatoes, and pastas; especially macaroni and cheese. ©




