It seems every time you turn on the TV, or read the news, something awful has happened yet again. Just yesterday as I went to read what was going on that day and read of a school shooting in Kentucky. Two people are dead. Countless others are injured. It wasn't even the top headlines of the day. I was sad for the people killed and injured. I was sad that this type of thing happens so often that it isn't even top news headlines anymore.

I sat and read and started to think of Psalm 79 where the psalmist writes: "How long, O Lord, how long?" I wonder the same questions.

How long, O Lord, how long?

How long do we have to read news headlines filled with hate, abuse, and murder?

How long, O Lord, how long?

How long until this world can unite as one to share our resources so no person goes hungry?

How long, O Lord, how long?

How long until this world can live at peace where we live as the one body of you, O Lord. How long until we live in a world where we are no longer labeled as being Jew or Greek, slave or free, American or not American, black or white, gay or straight, Republican or Democrat, rich or poor?

How long, O Lord, how long? Where is peace, O Lord, where is peace?

How long will we live in a world where people define themselves by how much money they have or do not have.

How long will your people think they have the power to label

others as outcasts or unfit? Help us, O God of our salvation, for the glory of your name; deliver us, and forgive our sins, for your name's sake.

"How long, O Lord, how long?" and then the psalmist writes: "Will you be angry forever?" and continues with:

"Do not remember against us the iniquities of our ancestors; let your compassion come speedily to meet us, for we are brought very low.

Help us, O God of our salvation, for the glory of your name; deliver us, and forgive our sins, for your name's sake."

My dear parish, how can we do better? How can we be sure that we leave our world a better place for the next generations? How long do we have to ask, "how long?" There is hope for our world even though some days it may seem like there is none. Let us discover that hope, feel the presence of the Holy Spirit, and get to work. Let us rest in God's love and call others to do the same, and let that love stir us to action. May you feel the presence of Christ this day even in the midst of things happening that make us wonder "how long?"

A Monthly Update from the Western North Dakota Synod Office



Witnesses of the Gospel...

As I write this (mid-January) a group of people from Western North

Dakota leave for the Central African Republic. We hope to share word from these witnesses of the Gospel in coming months. Rev. Janis Sloka, Executive Director of Camp of the Cross has a long standing relationship with Campamento Luterano Eduardo

Roig near Dorado, Puerto Rico. He along with seven others who have a connection to Camp of the Cross made the trek to help with hurricane recovery work. We thank God for their efforts and look forward to learning more from them.

Meanwhile, Rev. Taryn Montgomery, Bread of Life, Minot is spending a little over a week visiting our companion church – the Evangelical Lutheran Church of the Central African Republic. Through her visit she will get a chance see the ministries partner with in CAR. We look forward to learning more from her upon her return.

Plan to Attend...

Unhealthy conflict in a congregation undermines the proclamation of the Good News of Jesus Christ, that is a fact. One of the ways to avoid unhealthy conflict is to be clear about your congregation's purpose, according to Rev. Dr. Peter Steinke. Steinke has spent his career working with congregation's in conflict, writing about creating healthy congregations and teaching around these areas. We are glad to welcome Dr. Steinke to Western North Dakota for an afternoon workshop at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Bismarck on Sunday, February 11th from 2:00pm until 5:00pm. The cost is \$10 per person. This is an incredible opportunity to learn from an excellent teacher – we hope to see you there.

Synod Council to Meet...

Your synod council meets February 9th and 10th at Christ Lutheran in Minot. If there are issues you want discussed please let me know. Also, a reminder – the deadline for submitting resolutions for this year's synod assembly is March 31st. Contact Faith Simonieg if you have questions about the process of bringing forward resolutions.

Staffing Reorganization...

Some changes are in the works for the structure of synod staff. A decision has been made to outsource much of the bookkeeping work for the synod. This move is being made to reduce staffing costs within the synod but will result in loss of long time employee Monroe Madson. Monroe has faithfully served as the synod's Financial Administrator – always doing his best to oversee the gifts shared with the synod from individuals and congregations. He will continue to work in the office through mid-February. I am thankful for his servant's heart. This means that duties will shift within the office and that we will be bringing on a new part-time position. As with any change there will be a learning curve and we ask that you be patient with us as we engage this new staffing pattern. At the same time staff is looking closely at the synod's budget to make sure that we are best positioned to continue to provide for face to face contact with congregations. While Mission Support has been consistent it has not kept pace with inflation and rising costs.

What Am I Reading...

From time to time I am asked what I am reading. Here is what I am spending time with now: -Original Blessing: Putting Sin in its Rightful Place by Danielle Shroyer. In this Fortress Press book, Shroyer argues that the concept of original sin was an add on to the Christian faith several hundreds years after the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. Instead she argues that scripture instead speaks of original blessing, being beloved one of God. - The Agile Church: Spirit Lead Innovation in an Uncertain Age by Dwight Zscheile. Written by a Luther Seminary Professor, this book does an excellent joy of describing the sociological changes impacting the church today.

Mountrail County Food Pantry is a Prairie Lutheran Parish supported ministry.

The Mountrail Community Food Pantry provided 4950 pounds of food in December, which does not include the turkeys that were picked up at Cashwise by clients using their voucher. Of the 155 people, 73 were children and 22 were seniors. We were closed the last two Mondays in December, for Christmas and New Year's, so we served less families. We do post these holiday dates well in advance, though, so folks can plan to come in when we are open, trying to make certain that everyone that needs food, gets food. © We were so thankful to receive gaming funds from the Veterans Gaming Funds, from the Lucky Mound ALCW, Aux Sable, Secure Energy, many memorials from folks in honor of friends and loved ones, and several extremely generous donations from local folks. ©©

We had a lot of fun with the high school kids that came to help us unload a food truck. They were strong and ENERGETIC!!! It never fails to raise a person's spirits being around kids. ©

We were especially thankful for their help, because many of our regular volunteers were attending a funeral that day. I do post pictures on our Facebook page, if you would like to check that out. Aging Life Care Management

Aging Life Care™ professionals help find solutions in times of uncertainty; provide guidance and support to ensure quality care and well-being for loved ones; thus reducing worry, stress and time off for family caregivers. Tailored to the senior's need, services: assess and monitor; plan and problem solve; educate and advocate; support both care receiver and caregiver. As assisted living, and nursing home care costs continue to rise, Aging Life Care can coordinate necessary supports in the home, often at a much lower cost.

In the past year, 47 families connected with care managers to navigate health-care options in a flexible, person-centered manner.

Child Care Aware Start-Up Consulting

Child Care Aware has five consultants available to help people who want to be child care providers through the start-up process. Start-up services are offered from the time someone is considering opening a program, through the licensing process, until they have completed their first year as a licensed program and then applied re-licensure. CCA Start-Up Consulting has helped programs with technical assistance covering such topics as reducing health and safety risks, how to set up a great child care space, planning for children and the basics of owning your own business.

In the past year, 175 programs have received technical assistance in 64 communities.

LSSND Internships

Lutheran Social Services of North Dakota (LSSND) has always been a great place to be an intern but, the newly enhanced LSSND Internship Program adds some important features to the experiences that young professionals will get during the time they spend at LSSND: the chance to network with other students involved in the internship experience, access to a dedicated mentor, monthly intern chats, a work/life balanced schedule, and an intern-oriented evaluation.

LSSND is currently helping students from Concordia College, Minnesota State University Moorhead, North Dakota State University, and University of North Dakota complete internships in the following LSSND programs: Refugee Resettlement, Senior Independence, Unaccompanied Refugee Minors, and Luther Hall.

Monthly Stewardship Thoughts and Resources for You!

A Visit with Vincent - Generosity Changes Everything

You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Matthew 5:14.

Vincent and his wife worked hard on their farm, saving carefully for retirement. They loved their church and in addition to their congregation, they shared with numerous charities throughout their lifetimes. Thankful for the many ways God blessed them, they shared abundantly and lived a life of contentment. By sharing what God had entrusted to them to help others, they created a legacy of generosity. Toward the end of his life, Vincent asked his pastor, "Pastor, are other people sharing the way my wife and I have? Can you use my example of giving to open their hearts to give? So that they too may know the joy of generosity?"

Thankfulness, happiness and contentment interact, but gratitude holds the key. Develop gratitude, then happiness and contentment follow. It doesn't work the other way around. With prayer, devotion and simple exercises, the Holy Spirit will lead you to deeper spiritual maturity and more happiness. Here are some ideas for you and your family.

- \cdot Pray daily. Ask God to give you a greater sense of thankfulness. And then thank God for all the day's blessings.
- · Chart thankfulness. On a big wall calendar mark one thing for which you're thankful to God. Invite other family members to do the same. When you get in the habit of looking for them, you will find blessings everywhere.
- · Keep a "blessing list." Write down the things you are grateful for. Then as you say your nighttime and morning devotions, pray over the list: "God, I'm thankful for this, and I'm thankful for that." Revise the list as needed.
- · Send out thank-you notes. Buy a box of inexpensive thank you notes and send one every week. Go deep, thanking not only the folks who have given you a present or done a favor for you, but also those whose love, support, friendship, laughter, energy or presence are important to you.
- · Make a "thank offering." Express gratitude in a tangible way by contributing to your congregation or favorite church cause. Make the donation "just because," or in honor or memory of a loved one, or on the occasion of a special event or blessing in your life.

Adopt one or more of these exercises as a spiritual discipline and, with God's help, you will develop the attitude of gratitude that will bring more satisfaction, greater happiness, spiritual depth and emotional maturity to your life.




