Pastor Carter writes....
My Dear Parish,

I often sit in the sanctuary late in the evening on Sundays in nearly complete darkness listening to hymns and reflecting on the past week. This is often my time to worship. A time where I do not have to lead, or to worry about preaching, or a worship service at all, but rather a time to



be alone with God, to confess my sins, and to feel God's Spirit working within me. During this time is when I do my best writing and my most focused praying, it is where I give thanks to God each week for all of you, and where I listen deeply for where the Spirit may be calling us next. Sometimes I laugh out loud thinking back on the week we have had together, many weeks I shed some tears thinking about those of you that hurt, I forgive those that have sinned against me to start a new week free of burdens, and other times I sit down and breathe out the stresses and fears that come along with ministry and being your pastor.

Tonight, instead of complete darkness with only the dim light of my computer screen shining, I decided to turn on the new backlighting behind the cross in American's sanctuary. Usually I use my phone's flashlight to move around in the sanctuary during this time each week,

however, to my surprise, the light of the cross gives off just enough light to move around in the darkness - not enough to expose all threats or give one a clear picture, but just enough to be able to guide oneself around safely.

How true is this within everyday life? We are lost, broken, not sure what to do, and we feel as though we are walking in complete darkness, but that is simply not the case! My dear friends in Christ, the light of the cross is there. The light of Christ cannot be overcome by darkness, so however faint it may be, it has never completely gone away. Search for it. Take some time to yourself like I do each week and find where that light is shining, whether blindingly bright, or barely dimly lit, for that is the light that will lead you out of the darkness, or at the very least help you from completely stumh n g

My dear parish, know that I pray for you this night. May you find where the light of Christ shines in your life, and if you cannot, know that my door is always open, and I will help you see a r c h.

We received a gift from the Queen of the Most Holy Catholic Church, earmarked for breakfast cereals, and we ordered the full amount from our local Cashwise. © We also received memorials from folks in memory of friends and family. Our Jessica Swenson, formerly of Mountrail County Social Services, organized a food drive on Main Street, February 27th. She worked closely with the schools, and class after class arrived, holding signs, cheering, chanting their catchy made-up-on-the-spot slogans; and the excitement and energy could be felt and heard for blocks!!! © They filled the floor of the food pantry with bags and bags of food, as well as collected a lovely envelope filled with cash from passersby. It was yet another perfect example of the caring community we live in....from the organizers that worked diligently to get the wheels in motion to the students that gave their all to get donations, to the folks that donated!! And then, we don't want to forget the 7th grade confirmation class that helped put all of that food on the shelves, with the guidance of our loyal volunteers!! ### **Aging Life Care Management**

Aging Life Care™ professionals help find solutions in times of uncertainty; provide guidance and support to ensure quality care and well-being for loved ones; thus reducing worry, stress and time off for family caregivers. Tailored to the senior's need, services: assess and monitor; plan and problem solve; educate and advocate; support both care receiver and caregiver. As assisted living, and nursing home care costs continue to rise, Aging Life Care can coordinate necessary supports in the home, often at a much lower cost.

In the past year, 47 families connected with care managers to navigate health-care options in a flexible, person-centered manner.

### **Child Care Aware Start-Up Consulting**

Child Care Aware has five consultants available to help people who want to be child care providers through the start-up process. Start-up services are offered from the time someone is considering opening a program, through the licensing process, until they have completed their first year as a licensed program and then applied re-licensure. In the past year, 175 programs have received technical assistance in 64 communities.

Lutheran Social Services of North Dakota (LSSND) has always been a great place to be an intern but, the newly enhanced LSSND Internship Program adds some important features to the experiences that young professionals will get during the time they spend at LSSND: the chance to network with other students involved in the internship experience, access to a dedicated mentor, monthly intern chats, a work/life balanced schedule, and an intern-oriented evaluation.

LSSND is currently helping students from Concordia College, Minnesota State University Moorhead, North Dakota State University, and University of North Dakota complete internships in the following LSSND programs: Refugee Resettlement, Senior Independence, Unaccompanied Refugee Minors, and Luther Hall.

# **Symbols of Easter**

**Easter Lilies** = grows in the Spring close to Easter time, because they look like trumpets. They are a symbol of living forever with God.

**Butterflies =** A symbol of eternal life.

**Eggs** = Represent new life that returns to nature during Spring. Christians also view it as a reminder of the tomb from which Jesus Christ arose. Early Christians used red colored eggs to symbolize the resurrection.

**Cross =** Jesus crucifixion & resurrection victory over sin & death. Power to forgive sins & give new life to people.

**Lamb** = Lamb of God takes away the sin of the world.

**Palm Branches** = Palm Sunday is a moveable feast that falls on the Sunday before Easter. Feast commemorates Jesus & branches waved at the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem.


