Greetings from my backyard patio! It is a beautiful, sunny summer evening. I feel a nice breeze, I hear the song of the birds around me and everything is peaceful and the right in the world until I start spitting and coughing on the cotton seeds from the cottonwood tree. The cotton seeds are threatening to take over our entire backyard. It's making it's way into my garage, into my vehicle and into my garden! I hear my neighbors wonder out loud, "What good are these cottonwood trees?"

Somewhere in the midst of all the cotton flying around, I was reminded of the gospel that Pastor Carter preached on a few weeks ago. In Mark 4: 26-34, we hear the parable of the mustard seed. The part that came to my mind is, "It is like a mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in the shade." As I read this verse, I let my eyes take a really good look at the giant cottonwood tree down the alley and my eyes are open to a tree that is a shelter and home to wildlife, a source of food to many animals and insects and shade and protection in a young family's backyard. And I began to wonder, "What if we were more like a cottonwood tree?" Just imagine our tiny seeds of faith growing into something giant and beautiful. Next imagine that through our faith, our lives become a dwelling place for other people. People who are hurting, people in need, people who are different from you and me, people who are young, old and every age in between. My brothers and sisters in Christ, go out each day and give support to those around you. Go forth and share the

good news of Jesus Christ like the Cottonwood tree spreads its billowing cottony seeds. Today is the day to love and serve your neighbor and let your faith grow as big as the biggest cottonwood tree in western ND. The next time you see a cotton seed floating by, let it be a reminder of your faith and that it is meant to be shared.

The Mountrail Community Food Pantry served 52 families in March, 41 in May, for a total of 308 people, of which 120 were children and 30 were seniors. 10,324 pounds of food were provided for those families. We received a lovely donation from Faith Lutheran Church in Palermo, as well as from the Parshall Hi League, Shell Creek Church, and Women of Today. We were the recipients of the Veteran's Gaming Funds, twice!! The St. Joseph's Community Foundation awarded us funds, as well as approved a grant for our Special Needs Fund. A local rancher, who prefers to remain anonymous, gave us 75 pounds of delicious hamburger. We receive eggs from a grower on a regular basis. So, with all of that happy news in mind, I would like to close by saying that I am very thankful that we live in a community full of kind hearted people who want the best for everyone around them... and, as John says every time I ask him how he is doing, we are truly blessed. Here's to sunshine, healthy calves kicking up their heels as they race around the pasture, crops growing, kids riding their bikes, and maybe a whirlawhip!!

Synod News

Honest Talk...

We have just come off an amazing Synod Assembly. Our Presiding Bishop, Elizabeth Eaton, was engaging, witty and extremely honest. She talked openly about her 2016 statement on the Dakota Access Pipeline. Not backing away from what she wrote but at the same time saying she has come to an understanding that this is an extremely complex issue which will take her (and many others) a long time to truly understand.

Her openness to speak into this difficult subject, knowing how polarizing the topic can be was a blessing. It was a model for us to replicate – have open honest conversation about issues. One we need to address in this synod is racism, especially as it relates to how we interact with our Native American brothers and sisters. Pray that we can find ways to engage openly and honestly in these issues.

More Honest Talk...

We also talked openly about the finances of the synod. At the end of the past two fiscal years I have been forced to down-size staff. It meant saying good-bye to people who were valuable members of our team. However, as I look to 2020 and the election of the next bishop we need to have our financial house in order. The synod has been balancing our budget on the possibility of taking funds from reserves. We have not had to do that each year — because Mission Support from congregations has exceeded what we had budgeted. For that I say a huge thank-you.

At the same time, we need some honest talk. In cleaning our old paperwork, I ran across a report from 1993 listing the Mission Support from each congregation. Many congregations on the list are giving close to the same Mission Support today as they did 25 years ago, meanwhile inflation has increased 65%.

We have important work to do together as the Western North Dakota Synod. There are candidates for ministry to walk with; there are congregations who need conversation partners to dream new dreams and put action plans together; there are new ministry to start, like campus ministry in Bismarck; there are faith formation gatherings to create. Mission Support makes all of this and much more possible. Bottom line, without Mission Support our ministry is restricted.

A Time for Leadership... During our assembly I called for bold leadership. It is time for congregational members to stand up and clearly state that congregations exist for the sake of engaging God's Mission. Congregations exist so the Good News of Jesus is proclaimed, so the sacraments can be celebrated, so the Word can be heard and studied.

It is time for each congregation to engage conversation around mission and ministry in God's name. It is also time to stand up against petty arguing, gossip and any other actions which tear down the body of Christ. We are called to important work. We need leaders who are willing to share a vision beyond our own desires for the sake of those who do not yet know the love, grace & mercy available through Jesus.
