Yesterday as I was driving from school to church, I was going through my checklist of the things I needed to prepare for the upcoming week. My mind went from thinking about what I needed for confirmation the next day to worrying about the things that needed to be done for Red Ribbon Week at school to what I was going to feed my family for supper. I felt myself beginning to panic and to wonder out loud,"How am I going to get it all done?" In the middle of my thoughts, the words, "I just have to pray it up. Give it all to you cause you're enough. I don't have to make my own way" came out of my radio. Those words stopped my thoughts and they grabbed my attention. It was in that moment that the words from Joel Vaughn's song "Pray it Up," spoke to me. I look around and I see how busy we all are. There are so many things in our lives that demand our attention, our time, and our worry. These things leave us little to no time to spend on things that will allow us to focus our attention and time on prayer and scripture.

I am reminded of St. Teresa of Avila; Teacher and Renewer of the Church, who we commemorate on October 15. Teresa chose to live a religious life as a nun at the Carmelite Convent of the Incarnation just outside Avila. This covenant was large and very busy. Because of the luxuries and the distractions at the covenant, she found it extremely hard to meditate and pray. Can you relate to Teresa? Do you find it difficult to immerse yourself in meditation and prayer? Teresa, called by a vision, decided to leave the covenant and found a small

covenant. She went on to found many more similar covenants around Spain. Teresa and the nuns that lived in the houses, were known to go without shoes so that they could identify with the poor. Teresa found her life of faith and prayer deepening during this time.

I wonder what changes we can make in our life? Maybe it's setting aside time in the morning to meditate and pray. Maybe it's finding a quiet place away from the noise of life, even if that means the floor of your closet. I wonder what would happen in our lives and the world around us if we not only did as Joel Vaughn sang and pray it up but also live like Teresa lived by spending time without shoes and in prayer and meditation. It is then that our eyes and our hearts are lifted to Our Lord.

Synod News

Joy...

Where do you find joy? I invite you to grab a cup of coffee, sit back and ponder that question. What in your life brings you such peace, comfort or hope that you are willing to let someone else know?

Do you find this in your relationship with Jesus, the risen savior? A joy that comes from knowing you are a beloved child of God, no matter what! How does your connection to the life of your congregation help you live into your identity as God's beloved? How might you help those around you discover the same joy you have found through this relationship?

I invite you to ponder these questions. I want to push a little further though – how about if you gather with others from your congregation to think about these questions. I want us to realize that "church" is not an event – instead, worship is a relationship, a place where we can be honest before God about our failings, hear a word of forgiveness and be reminded that we are claimed as God's very own. It is in this that joy, peace and hope reside.

You are beloved! I encourage you to live out of that identity, inviting others to the joy you have found. We have been given gifts too precious to keep to ourselves.

Learnings from the Conference of Bishops...

As a conference we spent significant time talking about our priorities as a church together. We acknowledged that there is much this church does for the sake of the proclamation of the Gospel. At the same time we wrestled with where we can best invest our resources of time, talent and treasure.

One unexpected learning has to do with property insurance. Parishes may want to discuss whether it might be wise to have the same insurance carriers. A three-point parish, which has different insurance carriers can run into difficulties of which carrier is responsible for a covered loss. One example given was the embezzlement of parish funds.

The Conference also sent a letter to President Trump asking that budgeted funds be released to help support Augusta Victoria Hospital

in Jerusalem. The hospital is owned and operated by the Lutheran World Federation. It is a life line for cancer care and kidney dialysis.

End of Year Giving...

We are thankful for the faithful donations which through the years have helped build your Synod Endowment Fund. These funds help you do ministry in Christ's name. Whether it is through the Ministry Endowment which provides seminary scholarships, the Mission Endowment which helps provide seed money for creative Christ-centered ministries or the Accompaniment Endowment Fund which ensures there are people to walk with seminary candidates or those dreaming of new mission possibilities – Gospel proclamation is happening because of these funds.

As you approach the end of the year, a reminder, gifts of \$5,000 or more maybe eligible for a North Dakota State Tax Credit and may also provide a deduction on federal taxes – please check with your tax preparer for details.

I am ever so thankful for the generosity of people within this synod. Thanks be to God.
