In Luke 10:25-28, Jesus is asked the question, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus answers, "You shall love the Lord you God with all your heart, and with all your

soul, and with all your strength and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself." To which Jesus was then asked, "Who is my neighbor?" A question that has been running through my mind the past few weeks. According to Webster dictionary, when used as an adjective, neighbor means: being immediately adjoining or relatively near. And when used as a verb, neighbor means: to associate in a neighborly way. Growing up as a "town kid," my neighbors were all of the people within about a two block radius. My friends who would play games until dark, the widow who lived right next door, and the lady down the street who would welcome my friend and I in for cookies, juice and games. Clay grew up as a "farm kid." When I asked him what his description of a neighbor was, it was much different than mine. He described his neighbors as anyone living one mile to 20 miles away. He ended with, "Actually, my neighbors were anyone living on a farm!" His neighbors would give out full-sized candy bars at Halloween! Something that was unheard of for a "town kid!"

When you think about your neighbor, who comes to mind? A person living directly next to you? A person who lives within your community? Or do you think even further? Would you say that the term neighbor can be extended to the people of Powers Lake, New Town, Parshall, Berthold, Kenmare and Tioga? Could we go even farther and say that Minnesotans, South Dakotans, and Montanans are our neighbors? Or does the meaning of neighbor cross over borders into Canada, Mexico or maybe even further to neighboring continents?

As all of this is running through my mind, a second question was added to this question as I passed by Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Bismarck last week. The sign asked the question, "Have you blessed your neighbor today?" And I immediately thought, "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus answers this question in Luke 10:30-37 with the parable of the good samaritan. A story where both a priest and Levite returning from Jerusalem had ignored a wounded Jew on the treacherous Jericho Road, thus preventing defilement and avoiding responsibility for a fellow Jew. A hated Samaritan put his life at risk by stopping, treating the Jew's wounds, placing him on the Samaritan's own animal, and taking him to a nearby inn. There he negotiated with the innkeeper for the man's care, giving him two denarii (two days' wages) and promised to pay more, if needed. Then Jesus asked the scribe, "Which ... proved to be a neighbor?" the scribe avoided the hated word "Samaritan" and replied, "The one who showed mercy to him." Jesus responded, "Go and do the same"

As we begin a new year as church together, let us have eyes to see neighbors near and far who are in need. Let us share our blessings with neighbors near and far so that we may be showing mercy onto them. Let us listen to our hearts and serve You by serving others and sharing our gifts will all neighbors, near and far, so that we are pointing all to Jesus. I invite us all to reflect on the question, "Have you blessed your neighbor today?" as we make decisions as a church and as a Parish this coming year. And hear the words of Paul in Philippians 2:3-4, "Don't be selfish; Don't try to impress others. Be humble, thinking of others as better than yourselves. Don't look out for your own interests, but take an interest in others, too." Prairie Lutheran Parish, as we begin New Year together, Let us go in Peace and serve all of our neighbors. Thanks be to God.

<u>A Year that is New...</u>One of the gifts of the New Year is the chance to "start anew." We enter January as an artist facing a blank canvas – white, fresh, clean. The possibilities ahead are infinite. What colors will fill in the background? What is the subject of the painting? Where will the brush move us?

As I sat in worship recently we sang Marty Haugen's "Gather Us In." My imagination took ahold as I sang the words at the end of the second stanza, "...give us the courage to enter the song." I began to wonder about the new beginnings offered at this time of year. What would it mean to enter the song? Where might courage push me?

I invite you spend time pondering Haugen's words, his invitation to pray for courage to be the Good News of Jesus in a new or different way this coming year. I am not certain what that would look like in your life; my guess is that it would be different for each of us. But what if in the midst of our daily routines we looked for opportunities to let the Gospel sing through our words and deeds. No matter where we work, or reside, or wander, or shop, or live – each of us have opportunities to "enter the song" by truly loving others.

It seems to me our faith in Jesus is not lived out through extraordinary acts of self-sacrifice, as much as it is lived out through the very ordinary and mundane daily tasks which show we love others. Opportunities to be Christ's love come to us often. May you keep your eyes to notice them and then have "...the courage to enter the song."

<u>Assembly...</u> As you prepare for your annual meetings a reminder: each congregation of the synod is invited to elect at least two people. Assembly this year will be at The Grand in Minot. June 6 is preassembly and June 7th and 8th is the Assembly. We will gather under the theme: *The Kingdom of God is Like: Dreams – Desires – Demands.*
